



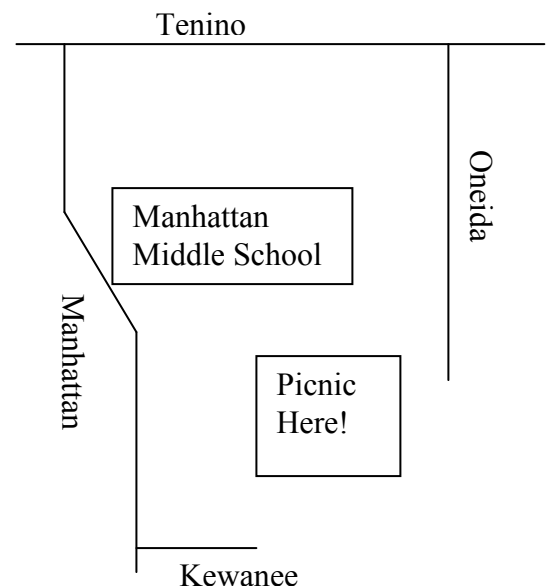

The Southeast Boulder Neighborhoods Association (SEBNA) was formed in 2007 and is focused on promoting and protecting our quality of life in southeast Boulder. SEBNA is designed to engage in activities such as:

- Building community by organizing social events, sharing information about the neighborhood, and other activities;
- Monitoring actions by the city, state and federal governments and other groups that affect the quality of the neighborhood, and Boulder in general;
- Maintaining contact with city and county service providers;
- Promoting actions by city, state and federal governments that will enhance the quality of the neighborhood;
- Joining with other neighborhood associations to promote shared goals;
- Organizing issue-related and candidate forums;
- Representing the neighborhood by participating in public forums and meetings;
- Organizing to acquire RTD neighborhood Eco-passes and other benefits; and
- Organizing and funding efforts to beautify the neighborhood.

A key issue for southeast Boulder is the proposed development of housing on vacant land near the East Boulder Recreation Center. *Development of new housing can have a substantial impact on flood risks, groundwater, traffic, quality of life, and the environment in southeast Boulder.* SEBNA members have identified this as a primary issue and have been actively involved in monitoring actions by the city, county, and developers and ensuring that concerns of neighbors are acknowledged in the planning process.
